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Commissary and Trust Fund Department of the Judicial Branch for the Government of The United States of America

Section 1. Intent

(a) The intent of the Commissary and Trust Fund Department, hereby established by the General Post Master Council, is to provide confined criminals with access to, without physical control of, personal funds and a method to purchase items not furnished to them by the Government while serving a prison term.

Section 2. Department Structure / Hierarchy

(a) The Commissary and Trust Fund Department shall be managed by the warden as trustee of the facility.

(b) The warden may appoint Co-trustees, managers, medical personnel regardless of type, and officers to operate the facility in accordance to its purpose.

(c) The warden is under strict adherence to the Universal Declaration of Human Rights wherein human rights will be observed when it pertains to management of the prisoners and development of policies and procedures of the prison. A human rights education program is required within each prison for prisoners and prison staff.

(d) All prisoners are required to understand the principles of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and practice each article on a daily basis before being considered for early release.



Section 3. Commissary Distribution Centers

(a) Purpose. The Commissary Distribution Centers are responsible for the procurement, storage and distribution of merchandise to the prison commissary for resale to confined criminals and prison employees.

(b) Primary Center. The location of the primary distribution center shall be determined by the General Post Master Council. Regional distribution centers may be established, as necessary, in approved locations to support delivery of products to prisons.

Section 4. Commissary, Staffing and Commissary Products

(a) Number of Commissaries. A prison may have more than one commissary, based on the prison size and sales volume.

(b) Staffing. The staffing of commissaries shall consist of a Commissary Manager, Assistant Manager and support associates, as deemed necessary to support business operations.

(c) Products. Commissary products are to be priced at fair market value and readily available at prison commissaries and to be priced at fair market value. The prison commissaries shall sell items including but not limited to personal hygiene products, educational supplies, clothing, entertainment and other items deemed appropriate to support a prisoner's general health and well-being during confinement. Food items shall include nutritional supplements and products to meet certain religious guidelines and requirements.

(d) Inventory Changes. The merchandise inventory of commissaries is subject to change based upon sales, supply pricing, terms and conditions, delivery and availability.

Section 5. Commissary Trust Fund Accounts

(a) The Commissary Trust Fund provides a place of safekeeping for funds that allows prisoners access to, but not physical control of, personal funds during a term of confinement.

(b) Authorized prisoners may use funds available in their trust fund accounts to purchase available merchandise from the prison commissaries.

(c) On-line Program. The Commissary and Trust Fund Department shall establish and utilize an online program (see Section 7), which allows family or associates the ability to purchase items from the commissary for eligible prisoners.

(d) Eligible Prisoners. The Commissary Trust Fund and related services are available to all prisoners. Services may be restricted or suspended as a result of human rights violations, violent acts or other abusive behaviors committed by a prisoner against other prisoners or facility staff.



Section 6. Audit Services Bureau

(a) The Commissary Audit Services Bureau within the Commissary and Trust Fund Department, to be established by the prison warden, is responsible for financial and operational audits at all commissary sales locations. It shall prepare monthly reports organized by commissary location, for inventory variations, turnover, and sales and shall furnish a quarterly report to the office of the Treasury for the Government of The United States of America.

(b) There is to be strict adherence to fair-market pricing for all inventory items available to prisoners through the commissaries.

Section 7. Online Commissary Purchase Program

(a) The Trust Fund Department utilizes an on-line program where family and friends may purchase up to +300.00 of commissary items every calendar quarter for eligible prisoners. The on-line amount purchased will not affect the amount that prisoners may spend on commissary items from funds deposited into the prisoner's trust fund account.

(b) **Delivery of Merchandise.** Merchandise purchased on-line will be delivered to the intended prisoner within four to seven business days from the transaction date with minor adjustments for weekends and holidays. The Commissary and Trust Fund Department is not responsible for delays in product delivery due to worker strikes, product shortages, natural disasters or other factors outside the control of the Commissary and Trust Fund Department.

(c) Deposits to Prisoner's Trust Fund Account

(1) Family or associates may, as an alternative to or supplement of purchasing specific merchandise, elect to deposit funds directly into a prisoner's trust fund account.

(2) **Crediting of Deposit.** On-line deposits to a prisoner's trust fund account will be transferred into the prisoner's trust fund account on the next business day after GPEX receives the deposit transaction details.

Section 8. Restrictions to On-line Commissary Purchase Program.

(a) **Prisoner Status.** Prisoners placed on commissary restriction or under commissary suspension due to human rights violations, and violent and abusive acts, are not eligible to receive commissary purchases through the on-line program.

(1) Commissary staff does not determine or control a prisoner's eligibility for this program.

(b) **Status Report Obligation.** The Commissary and Trust Fund Department is under no obligation to provide eligibility status reports or details to a prisoner's family or associates.



(c) **Limited Use of Funds.** All deposits made into a prisoner's trust account, including payments from the Social Assistance Act, become the property of the trust and may only be used for commissary purchases.

(d) **Unused Deposits.** Any positive balance remaining in the prisoner's trust account at the time of the prisoner's release or death will be placed into the custody of the office of the Treasury for the Government of The United States of America and credited into the General Government Fund to be credited to the apportioned yearly bill to American Nationals supporting the Government of The United States of America.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

The General Post Master Council reserves the right to alter, amend, or strike any part of the Commissary and Trust Fund Department for the purpose of affecting the stringent process of corrections and rehabilitation of prisoners held within the facility.


